

Linton Hall School Pre-Kindergarten Program

The goal of the LHS Pre-Kindergarten Program is to promote all aspects of child development in a Christian environment. A wide variety of materials and activities will be used to meet the individual needs of each child. The program reflects the belief that all children are active learners, however, each child is viewed as an individual and instruction will be carefully organized to provide for the different developmental levels of the children. LHS is fully accredited by the Virginia Association for Independent Schools and is licensed through the Virginia Department of Social Services.

Social/Emotional/Personal Development:

The children will begin to develop personal and social skills that will enable them to function well within the social setting of the classroom and the community. The children will be instructed and encouraged with praise and positive motivation which will help to foster a feeling of comfort and trust in their new environment where they will be happy and eager to learn.

Spiritual Development:

Religion will be integrated into the curriculum throughout the day. The children will learn about God and Jesus through daily bible stories, prayer, songs and finger plays. They will begin to understand the importance of God's word and His gifts to us. The children will also learn about various events in the liturgical year, such as Advent, Christmas and Lent.

Cognitive Development:

The program will foster intellectual growth by helping the children become confident learners through a thematic centered based hands-on approach to learning. The curriculum includes the Houghton Mifflin reading program, along with Language Arts, Math, Social Studies, Science, Fine Arts, Religion, Spanish and Technology.

Physical Development:

A goal of the program is to help the children increase their fine and gross motor skills and feel more confident with what their bodies are able to do. The children will participate in daily activities to increase their large motor coordination such as running, jumping, skipping, dancing, balancing, throwing and climbing. Fine motor skill activities include cutting, drawing, painting, puzzles, play-doh, manipulatives, using scissors, building with blocks, stringing beads and lacing.
